## NC DPI Announces Slight Decrease in SAT Scores for Class of 2020

As seen trending in students around the nation, SAT scores for the class of 2020 has taken a slight decline. These results were released on September 9, 2020 by The College Board and may be [viewed here](#).

The national average fell 9 points from 2019 to 2020, and North Carolina saw a 2-point decrease from 2019 to 2020. The average score for NC graduates in 2020 was 1089, from 1091 in 2019. This is higher than the national average of 1030 (down from 1039 in 2019.)

In comparison, Davie County Schools' students taking the SAT saw no change in SAT scores from 2019 to 2020, and scores exceed the state and national averages at 1121. In 2020, Davie County Schools was 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Piedmont Triad region in average total score and 14<sup>th</sup> in the state out of 115 school districts in NC.
